New Changes – Where will the Spirit move us next?

There has been a lot going on behind the scenes that we would really like to make known to everyone in the congregation and everyone who continues to support the work of our ministry:

First, is our challenge to change grant. We've been trying to keep you up-to-date as much as possible. The great thing is work should be beginning shortly! We recently had a site visit with a member of Servant Hearts Ministry who will be helping us with doing most of the labor for free. They will be sending us a list of needed supplies along with a timeline of when the work can begin and about how long it will take to finish.

We are very excited about getting the old chapel/gym space back in working order! Especially, to help support culture and art in our own community! Once the space is done we can start hosting different events like art shows, poetry slams, open mic nights, etc... Any interest in helping with the planning of these events please speak with Pastor Erin. It would be great to form a committee to begin planning for when the space is open for use!

Second, Pastor and a few members have been going to financial meetings put on by the Presbyterian Foundation. They are geared at helping small churches figure out ways to move forward stronger financially. These meetings have been great at giving us different ideas and helping us to prepare for some possible changes – even the possibility of a capital campaign! There is still a good bit of planning that needs to be done with the session and with more conversations through our representatives from the Presbyterian Foundation but we are really excited with some of the options they talked about with moving forward.

Third, we have been trying to get more connected with the local farmers in our community. A few from Rise and Root Farm (who also own Crock and Jar) reached out to us a few months ago about sharing our kitchen space. Out of some great conversations we are allowing Crock and Jar to use our space for their canning and preserving needs with a trade-off of doing cooking demonstrations (and hopefully eventually some cooking classes) with food pantry recipients. Possibly even cooking classes with different youth once school starts back up, too. Along with this, one of the collaborators of the Green Onion (farmer's market downtown) has reached out to us about forming some connections and help with cooking classes, demonstrations, and even some food education as well with our food pantry. We are all very excited about these connections and hope to see great fruits as we move forward together.

We are continually discerning where the Spirit might be moving us next as the body of Christ we aren't called to remain static, to remain still. Instead, we are told to go. We are told to go out and make disciples, go out and teach, go out and baptize, go out to all the nations. So let us remain faithful to the call to go. If you have any new ideas or suggestions about new things we can try (examples: new worship services, book studies, leading a bible study at the diner or downtown, etc...), new connections we should try to be making within the community, or if you have any concerns about any of these new things happening please speak to Pastor Erin.
