



My, oh my, where has the year gone? Does anyone else feel like this? I know around September and the start of school many wonder where the summer went, but lately I'm left feeling like what happened since March? Has it really been 5 months since we've been able to gather in-person for worship? Some days it feels like just yesterday and other days it feels so long ago. With various issues of technology it's been, at times, harder to feel more connected. Though I am so incredibly thankful for the various modes of technology we do have that have helped us reach out to each other (even if just by snail mail!). But, perhaps the hardest part of all of this is what we still don't know what the future looks like... while we hope to gather again for outdoor worship, it's not clear how long this will last, if it will be safe to gather for indoor worship when the temperature changes, and if it is, how long until we may have to shut down completely again and go back to doing everything virtually. We really are living in some unknown times.

And while we may have felt like this before, wondering what's next in our life, the lives of our children, nieces, nephews, family and friends, perhaps it's never quite been to this extreme. Perhaps, now more than ever, we can relate to much of the books of the prophets in the Old Testament. I'm thinking of Isaiah and Jeremiah, among the small prophets, too. In many of these chapters of these books, as well as some of the Psalms, the Israelites are living in exile. All that they have ever known about life is gone. Some have been taken captive and living in a foreign land, some were left behind in their homeland only to be kicked out of their homes and live in some terrible conditions. Some question where God is, how it could get so bad, what hope do they have, what is next, what does the future look like... And perhaps, unlike the Israelites, we might listen better to the voices of the prophets. Voices that tell us we are to change our ways. Voices that tell us God is still with us but God desires devotion over sacrifice. Voices that tell us to do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with God. Voices that remind us our ancestors have been in similar situations of unknown before, but that God has gotten them through, provided, and God will continue to provide. Voices that tell us nothing will be the same, but God is still with us.

Yes, we certainly live in many times of unknown right now, but I encourage you to take some time and read through the prophets. Read the book of Isaiah, the book of Jeremiah, even Lamentations. Read the Psalms and the minor prophets – Micah, Amos, and Hosea. Read about the times of unknown, distress, and wondering. And find the words of hope nestled in them, too. Yes, even here in the midst of the unknown, the panic, the distress, the fear God has left them, there are still words of hope. It doesn't mean everything goes back to being the same, that nothing changes, but just that there is hope. Hope in God, hope that God will again do a new thing, hope that the love of God is still present with us.

Food Pantry Update

The Food Pantry continues to serve about 50 families. We are thankful for our volunteer base that has somewhat expanded and the hopes of what this means moving forward with the pantry. The local farmers continue to support with donated produce, and a few local businesses (as well as many community members) continue to help collecting donations and drop offs. We've also been partnering with the Florida Pantry. They give out Thursday mornings and we pick up any perishable items that won't last until the next distribution for our distribution Thursday afternoon. It is such a blessing to not just have such support but to be able to work in partnership with others. A truly living out of the community God calls us to be! Praise be to God!

Recycling, currently collecting:

- Vitamin and supplement packaging, Personal care and foot care packaging, and throat and nasal care packaging (blister packs, tubes, bottles, caps, lids, cans, boxes) and Infant formula and child nutrition packaging (tubs, bottles, caps, lids, cans, boxes)
- Any old cell phone cases or Popsocket brand products
- disposable razors and its packaging
- empty writing instruments (pens, markers, etc...), glue sticks, watercolor dispensers, paint sets, and flexible packaging.
- old cell phones, tablets, laptops, and inkjet cartridges (from HP and Cannon only, no toner cartridges). However, it is recommended that all personal information be cleaned from the devices before they are sent in.
